With extra attention as follows: Check clothing of rider is suitable e.g current hat standard, suitable footwear and shoulders covered, gloves worn and no flapping clothes. Assess suitability of horse to include size/weight ratio horse/rider, suitability of lesson subject and suitability to meet the learning needs of the rider. Check tack safety, fit and suitability. This must also meet the size of rider, where horses have two saddles ensure correct one is used for activity. Mount via mounting block at main stable yard or in arena if more suitable. Check arena is level and free from abnormal hazards. If working in jumping/XC field assess ground conditions and moderate lesson accordingly. Check all equipment is safe and suitable prior to use e.g white arena boards free from damage, broken jumps removed and replaced, portable mounting block stored in safe place, keep equipment tidy. Ensure all clients know who you are and are encouraged to voice any concerns they may have. Assess each rider briefly at the beginning of every lesson, however many times they have been coached. Continue to assess rider ability, suitability of exercise, throughout the lesson. It is suggested this is done verbally with continuous feedback encouraged, this feedback should be from client to coach and vice versa. Encourage clients to ask questions and verbalise any concerns or areas they are finding difficult to understand. All lessons must be flexible and adapted to suit the needs of the day, continuous risk
